

Liverpool 2017 Study Holiday



This year **Liverpool**, the city with the most museums and art galleries outside London, was chosen for the **English** Study Holiday destination. Our group flew in on 9th September and will be here until 23rd.

45 students from the 4th and 5th years are spending 2 weeks at the **Liverpool School of English**. They are all staying in host family accommodation and every morning they make their way to school by bus or train.

In the morning they follow either their **C1** Advanced or **B2** Upper Intermediate classes with students of other nationalities, or the **B1** Intermediate closed groups. All classes are small, usually no more than 10 students in each class and their qualified English teachers use a communicative approach.

Then, twice a week in the afternoon they are in 4 closed groups and study topics of social-historical interest: the **Industrial Revolution**, **Emigration** to the USA, the **Slave Trade** and **Irish** Immigration. These lessons begin in the classroom and finish in an appropriate museum.

Furthermore, 6 hours in the afternoons have been dedicated to “Alternanza Scuola Lavoro” project with visits to the **Jaguar** /Land Rover factory and the John Moore **University** of Liverpool.

At the weekends the students have gone on full day excursions to the well known **Lake District** and the nearby city of **Manchester**. They particularly enjoyed the tour around Old Trafford football stadium.

Today we are going to **Crosby** beach to see an open air art installation and in the afternoon we are looking forward to listening to live bands playing covers of Beatle songs at the famous **Cavern Club**. Liverpool is the home of the **Beatles** and the city has many landmarks to recall their amazing leap to fame in the 60s.
